The American Schools of Oriental Research are happy to announce the publication of the first of a series of volumes presenting and interpreting that part of the manuscript material discovered in the cave near the Dead Sea in 1947 that came to St. Mark's Monastery at Jerusalem and is at present in the hands of Mar Athanasius Yeshue Samuel, Syrian Archbishop of Jerusalem and Transjordan.

Keeping in mind the needs of scholars, the American Schools are presenting in the first volume collotype facsimiles of the texts, column by column, and are limiting comment to brief introductions giving essential technical information. To facilitate the use of the facsimiles the text of each column is rendered line by line in Hebrew type on the opposite page. In the transcription of the Isaiah and Habakkuk texts the proper chapter and verse numbers are added.

At present three volumes are projected. Volume II, which will also be issued if at all possible in 1950, is to contain *The Sectarian Manual of Discipline* and the document identified tentatively as *The Aramaic Book of Lamech*. This volume will be similar in character to Volume I. Volume III is to bring critical analyses, translations and bibliography.
